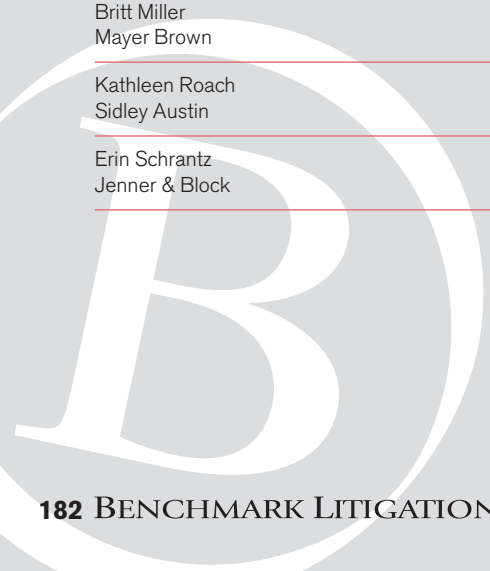

Illinois

Illinois remains the undisputed hub of litigation in the Midwest. Chicago is home to many of the country's top antitrust, securities and white-collar crime litigators, but the state is also witnessing an increase in the products liability and intellectual property areas. Beyond Chicago, Illinois litigators handle matters relating to rural concerns including environmental and land use disputes.

Highly recommended firms

Bartlit Beck Herman Palenchar & Scott

Bartlit Beck Herman Palenchar & Scott retains trial lawyers, not simply litigators. The small size of the firm and small teams that are assigned to each matter are designed to provide clients with transparency and efficiency. "They stand up to the larger firms in the area," observes one competitor. Additionally, in the majority of cases the firm allows for flexible and results-driven fee arrangements to be customized by the firm and the client.

Peers revere **Frederick Bartlit** as "a genuine trial lawyer." In 2008, he defended United States Surgical Corporation in a patent infringement suit in which the plaintiff alleged that the defendant infringed a medical device patent and sought \$300 million in damages and an injunction. Bartlit won a non-infringement verdict after a five-week trial. Competitors regard **Philip Beck** as a "heavyweight" for his "exceptional trial skills." His clients include Merck and Ernst and Young. **Adam Hoeflich** recently represented Dupont in 22 class actions, with plaintiffs claiming that Dupont's Teflon coating was unsafe and seeking up to \$5 billion in damages. In May 2009, the plaintiffs dropped the case. **Chris Lind** receives praise for his "exceptional trial skills."

Kirkland & Ellis

Kirkland & Ellis has a 100-year history of providing litigation, bankruptcy and white-collar investigation services on a national and international basis. In addition to its Chicago headquarters, the firm also maintains outposts domestically in Los Angeles, New York, Palo Alto, San Francisco and Washington, D.C., and abroad in Hong Kong, London and Munich.

Senior partner **Richard Godfrey** has acted as trial and appellate counsel in individual and class action suits involving antitrust, insurance, and products liability. His clients include 3M, Citicorp and ExxonMobil. **David Bernick** tries cases involving environmental crimes, products liability, and commercial class actions. He represents tobacco companies such as Brown & Williamson, American Tobacco and Philip Morris, and pharmaceutical companies such as Abbott Laboratories. Within the last year, he was lead counsel in the defense of specialty chemicals company W. R. Grace and its former executives for alleged environmental crimes in connection with a former Montana mining operation. W.R. Grace was ultimately not held

liable. **Stephen Patton** has extensive trial experience in complex commercial litigation and products liability cases, including the defense of RJ Reynolds involving claims of \$1 billion in "non-participating manufacturer" adjustments to payment obligations under a Master Settlement Agreement between tobacco companies and 46 states.

Mayer Brown

Peers refer to Mayer Brown as the firm "everyone knows in Chicago." Its 500-lawyer Chicago office is one of the largest in the city.

The firm's Appellate Litigation Group is headed by **Stephen Shapiro**, who peers herald as "one of the country's top appellate lawyers." In 2008, he successfully litigated *Stoneridge Investment Partners vs. Scientific-Atlanta, Inc.* which *The Wall Street Journal* called "the biggest securities litigation court clash in a generation." Shapiro obtained dismissal of the claims on behalf of both defendant product manufacturers. **Andrew Marovitz**, referred to by peers as an "antitrust expert," recently obtained dismissal of a major case against Swift, a supplier of messaging services to financial institutions, which was sued for privacy rights violations after it was revealed that Swift had been using its technology to track individuals suspected of terrorism in accordance with subpoenas issued by the Bush administration in the wake of the 9/11 attacks. He is currently representing BASF in a price-fixing case. **Daniel Ring** acted as lead counsel in a 2009 victory defending Medtronic against personal injury and economic damages claims.

Sidley Austin

Another Chicago-based firm with a broad network of offices domestically and internationally, Sidley Austin receives resounding praise from the Illinois legal community. "There are no surprises with them; it's a very good firm with quality lawyers," says a peer. The firm's practice portfolio is deep and varied, with each of its main practices divided further into several sub-specialties.

One peer calls **William Conlon** the "go-to guy at Sidley." Conlon's work includes antitrust, securities, banking, accountants' liability, insurance, utilities law, and a variety of complex commercial individual and class action cases. **David Pritikin** chairs the firm's national intellectual property practice and serves as lead counsel in many high-profile patent cases, including over a dozen Hatch-Waxman cases involving pharmaceutical

In 2008, he successfully defended the constitutionality of a state law limiting the liability of hospitals and physicians for noneconomic damages in medical malpractice cases.

Winston & Strawn is an international law firm with more than 900 attorneys among 12 offices. The firm's presence in Illinois is acknowledged by peers as "excellent, with some outstanding lawyers." In April 2009, the firm successfully represented OPTi in a \$19 million patent infringement case against Apple, Inc.

Dan Webb earns sweeping praise from peers, who call him "tremendous" and "the best trial lawyer." Peers call **Bruce Braun** a "very good young lawyer." He has represented Microsoft in a variety of cases involving patent, antitrust and securities issues and also represents McDonald's Corporation in a series of class action lawsuits regarding obesity and trans fatty acids. **Andrew DeVooght** made partner with the firm last year and is tipped as a future star by his peers.

Skadden Arps Slate Meagher & Flom continues to make significant inroads into the Chicago litigation market, with lawyers in this office handling large-scale securities, commercial, mass tort, products liability and insurance litigation. Skadden’s antitrust practice has been picking up steam as well. Within the last year, the firm’s Chicago office recently handled a case on behalf of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange regarding its more than \$10 billion acquisition attempt of The New York Stock Exchange (NYMEX). Plaintiff alleged that the NYMEX board had breached its fiduciary duties in connection with the merger. The cases ended in a settlement of all associated claims.
